The Justice Parker Lee McDonald Law Library and the Highlands County Bar Association are pleased to announce that Law Day 2023 will be held on **Thursday, April 27, 2023**, celebrating the theme:

“CORNERSTONES OF DEMOCRACY: CIVICS, CIVILITY, AND COLLABORATION”

An annual series of events celebrating our legal system, Law Day has special significance in Highlands County. Our courts are in recess as we hold our Law Day observance and focus on students and their civic education. Many county, circuit, and district judges, as well as Florida Supreme Court justices, have attended our local Law Day program.

Information and entry forms for student contests are enclosed with this packet. The prizes for these contests include monetary awards of \$100 for first place, \$50 for second place, and \$25 for third place in each respective category. Prizes are awarded by Highlands County Circuit Court Judge Angela J. Cowden at our Law Day ceremony. Teachers and students will be requested to attend the award ceremony to be recognized, allowing parents and the press an opportunity for photographs.

Winning posters will be displayed on the front windows
of the Highlands County Government Center.

In conjunction with Law Day, members of the Highlands County Bar Association are available to present virtually or in person to your individual classes to speak to students about the importance of our nation’s legal system and this year’s Law Day theme:

CRITERIA: **All entries must be the student's individual, original work.** If you are quoting someone, please give proper credit. The age of the participant will be considered.

Essays will be judged on:

- Content
- Adherence to the theme
- Personal reflection
- Originality

Essays must be typed and double-spaced on one side of 8½" x 11" paper. (Elementary entries may be handwritten.) **A completed Law Day Entry Form must be stapled to each essay. Do not put your name on the front of the essay.**

All essays may be published and are the property of the Justice Parker Lee McDonald Law Library.

The Law Day Committee welcomes all entries that relate to the contest theme. However, the Committee reserves within its discretion the right to disqualify any entry that is deemed to be offensive or not related to the theme of the contest.

ELIGIBILITY: Any individual student enrolled in a Highlands County public, private, virtual, or home school in Grade Levels K-1, 2-3, 4-5, 6-8, and 9-12 in Highlands County.

THEME: **POSTER THEMES MUST BE ORIGINAL AND MUST HARMONIZE WITH THE THEME:**
**"CORNERSTONES OF DEMOCRACY:
CIVICS, CIVILITY, AND COLLABORATION"**

GUIDELINES:

1. Only individual student entries are allowed.
2. Original posters must be submitted on a single sheet of **white 12" x 18" poster board**—no foam core or plain paper, please.
3. Any non-smearable medium is acceptable such as colored pencils, markers, crayons, or paints (no glitter please).
4. No loose or hanging materials are permitted.
5. Each poster must depict the Law Day theme. A **one paragraph statement describing how the poster reflects the theme** is required on the back of the poster.
6. All entries must be accompanied by the **attached Entry Form, glued to the back** of the poster.

CRITERIA:

CONTENT:

1. Must reflect the theme.
2. Must be the student's individual work.

LETTERING: Lettering should be clearly legible.

JUDGING: The age of the participant will be considered. Other criteria for the selection of the award-winning posters includes:

1. Clarity and readability of the work
2. How well the theme was expressed
3. Artwork and execution
4. Visual impact of the poster design
